Kiwaniis of Kiev keeps working in directions:

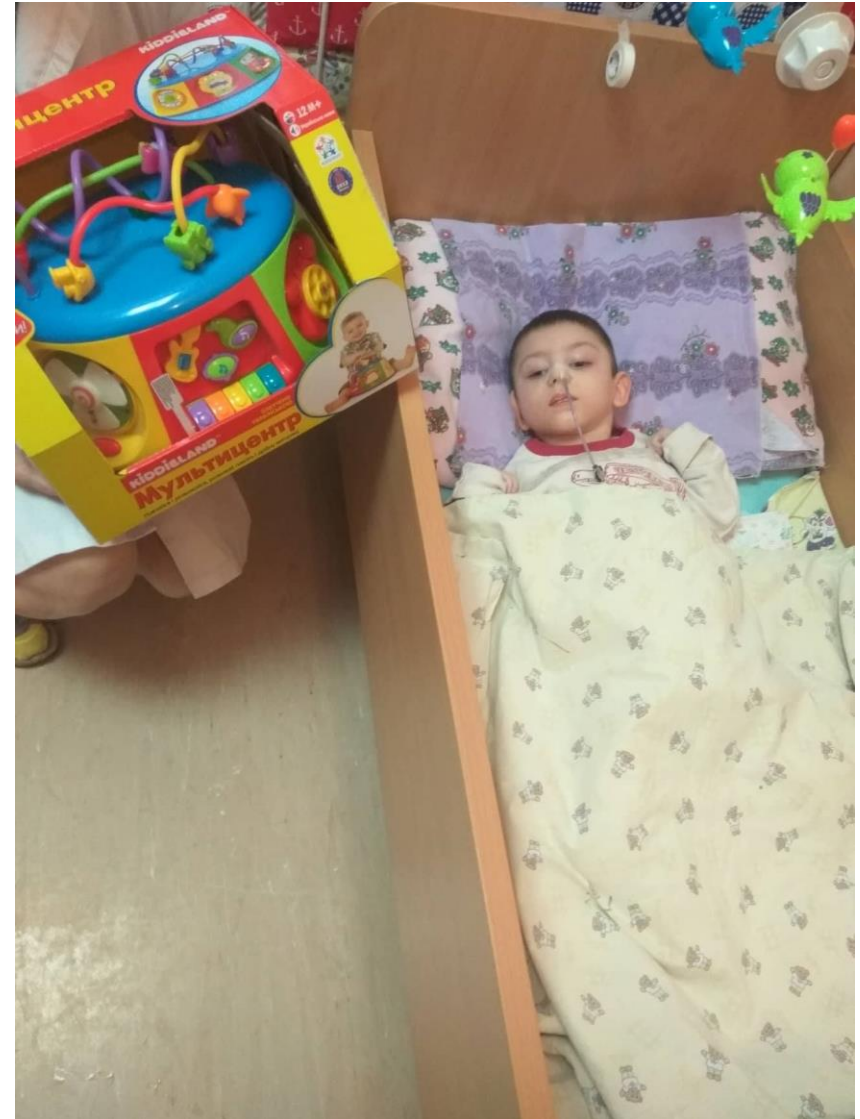
# Ministry for young mums

Work with young moms from crisis families and moms who are abandoned by husbands to help raise their children. We have supported 30 young moms by giving them clothes and medicines. We continue to carry out the Mom's Club with about 50 young moms. They have fellowship and have teachers & psychologists to help members of the club.



# Serving to handicap children

We continue to carry out programs for children with autism and other disability. And also work with parents whose children have been diagnosed with cerebral palsy by furnishing them with clothes and vitamins.



# Support of poor families with children

Help to poor families whose basic need in a current year is clothes and materials for personal hygiene , clothing, toys and baby food for small children.



# Support of ukrainian war refugees families

We support war refugees & their families from the East of Ukraine with gathering & distributing clothes to the special centers for refugees. For the Charity event for kids, we took girls 5-11 years old to the Princess Ball.

# Youth Summer Camp

In the summer we held a camp for teenagers from 14 to 18 years old. This year, we had 60 teenagers. Many of these teenagers were from orphanages. We camped in the campground on the shore of the Kiev Sea. In the camp, teens do everything themselves. They collect & cut wood to cook food, cook the food themselves, clean the territory, build a tent camp and sleep in it. We call our camp a Survival Camp. This year, military instructors were invited to teach the teenagers how to protect themselves. We invited psychologists to help teens with psychological trauma. A team of young people from America came to our camp from the state of Florida to help. It was a good time to learn English and work together. It was a special.





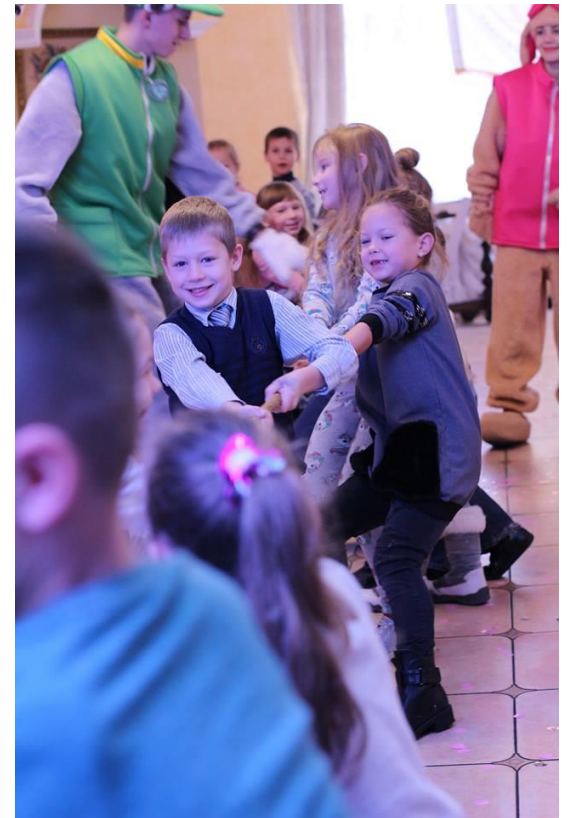
